



## Short Bowel Oral Multi-Vitamin/Mineral Routine Prescription

This is a unique prescription that has been compounded at the Medicine Shoppe College Plaza.	RE: _____ PHN: _____
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1. **Infantol (multivitamin) 5 mL orally t.i.d.**
2. **Calcium - ~ 500 mg (elemental) orally b.i.d**
  - a. calcium gluconate – Injections – 100 mg/ml (elemental Ca)
  - b. 2.5% calcium gluconate Gel = 500 mg per 25 g sachet
  - c. Gram Cal effervescent tablets = 1000 mg (elemental Ca) [contains calcium lactate – gluconate and CaCo<sub>3</sub>]
  - d. Calcium Sandoz Forte effervescent tablets = 500 mg (elemental Ca) [contains calcium lactate-gluconate, CaCo<sub>3</sub> and sucrose]
3. **Ferrous sulphate liquid, 300 mg (~60 mg elemental iron) orally b.i.d.**  
[should be taken separately from Ca due to interactions]
4. **Osto-forte gel caps (Vitamin D2 ) 50, 000 IU orally once weekly**
5. **Vitamin K 10 mg orally b.i.d.**
6. **Vitamin E gel caps 800 IU orally daily**
7. **Phosphate Sandoz effervescent tablet 500 mg (~500mg elemental phosphate) orally bid**
8. **K-10 potassium liquid, 60 mL (~78 mEq KCl ) orally b.i.d.**
9. **Magnesium - ~ 150 mg orally b.i.d.**
  - a. Magnesium glucoheptonate liquid 30 mL B.I.D. (= 150 mg Mg B.I.D)
  - b. Magnesium oxide tablets – 850mg (500 mg elemental Mg) - Effervescent tablets have much better taste than liquid
